With ancestry like her great-aunt Queen Soraya of Afghanistan, it is no surprise that Nilufer Tarzi Kuran's jewellery should reflect her intense emotional connections with her family, her home in Istanbul (she grew up in exile, in Turkey) and her love of history "I loved playing with my mother's jewels and hearing my father's stories of life in Afghanistan," she says.
